As the Beyond 50 Plan begun in 2019, our Parish strived to accomplish many objectives to improve and enhance our Nativity of Christ community as a whole. One of the ways we envisioned making our Parish strong and vibrant is through a preschool. With the hiring of Eleni Kelly as our Ministries Director and the knowledge of Daphne Cummings and Fran Corcoran, much progress has been made to making this a reality.

In the month of February, we anticipate receiving approval to become an officially licensed child care center. Upon this approval, we will immediately begin to engage our



community about the Nativity of Christ Preschool through a new w e b s i t e , postcards, social media, flyers, and large signage in public areas.

On Sunday, February 25, prior to our Parish Assembly, we hope to have our first ever tour of the Nativity of Christ Preschool for the stewards of our community. It is our prayer that this new ministry will serve our Nativity families to further connect them with our faith and community life. The search for a qualified teacher will begin in March.

Opening a preschool is no small endeavor and continued gratitude is expressed to all those who have financially contributed to the Beyond 50 Plan. It is through these funds that roughly \$18,000 has been spent for the needed fencing, materials, furniture, licensing fees and safety upgrades.

As our Parish embarks on this exciting new

endeavor, may the Holy Spirit continue to guide and direct our the paths in direction that leads eternal to salvation. May we always feel strengthened start our children off on the way that they should go that they may never turn from it.




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What is Love?


So it is that love as goodness,




Karen looks forward to serving on the Parish Council once again and am grateful for the opportunity to do so.

<u>Did you know...</u> <u>Philoptochos History</u>

The Philoptochos society began the 1970's with new vigor and membership increased. New national and ecumenical humanitarian and educational programs were undertaken.

When Patriarch Athenagoras, the founder of Philoptochos, suddenly died, Philoptochos established a scholarship at Holy Cross School of Theology in his name. In addition, many donations were made in his memory across the US and Greece. This was the beginning of a scholarship program for the students at Hellenic College and Holy Cross that exists to this day.

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








<u>Sarah Byrne Martelli at Nativity</u>

She is endorsed by the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese and Board Certified, with subspecialty certification in Hospice and Palliative Care, by the Association of Professional Chaplains/Board Certification Commission Inc. She is also the Secretary of the Board of the Orthodox Christian Association of Medicine, Psychology, and Religion.

She joyfully mentors new chaplains and chaplaincy students within the Orthodox Church, and regularly offers workshops such as "Exploring End of Life Questions," "Joy Comes in the Mourning," and "Grieving as Orthodox Christians."

CHRYSOS

JUNIOR DIVISION

(GRADES 7-9)

TOPIC 1: His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew has earned the title of the Green Patriarch, and was named one of Time Magazine's 100 Most Influential People in the World, for His teachings about humanity's spiritual responsibility for taking care of God's creation — planet earth. His All-Holiness stands on the shoulders of Saints, who taught that the world is a gift from God, and that taking care of His creation is a way to connect with God. Explore and discuss the teachings of His All-Holiness and the Saints on the creation of the world. What some of our practical responsibilities as stewards of our planet, and how does that enrich our lives as Christians?

TOPIC 2: Many of us have heroes to whom we look up. It may be an older brother or sister, an athlete, or a musician. We have heroes in our religious life, as well as people who inspire us to practice our faith. They teach us, usually by example, how we ought to live as Orthodox Christians. Select a Saint or person who has been the most influential in your spiritual life. Describe the particular and practical ways that influence has taken place.

TOPIC 3: On the Day of Theophany (January 6), we chant, "All those who were baptized in Christ have put on Christ" (Gal. 3:27). Discuss the meaning of this hymn and the obligations it places upon us as Orthodox Christians.

TOPIC 4: When reading the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15: 11-32), we learn about the various stages of repentance. What are they? How do they relate to the reversal of the son's journey away from the father? What does the father's reaction upon seeing his son teach us about our relationship to our Father in Heaven?

TOPIC 5: The Orthodox Church has a rich heritage of sacred hymns that "contribute radiant and poetic splendor to Orthodox worship," thus, opening the way to God. Select your favorite Church hymn and talk about how it strengthens your faith.

SENIOR DIVISION (GRADES 10-12)

TOPIC 1: Slandered without cause, convicted without a trial, exiled unjustly — this was the life endured by one of the greatest saints of our times — Saint Nektarios of Aegina. Forgiving others who hurt us that deeply and unjustly seems almost impossible. What can we learn from Saint Nektarios, whose life was about forgiving what some might call the impossible?

TOPIC 2: Apostle Paul refers to Adam as the first man, and Christ as the Second Adam. The Fathers of the Church, especially Saint Irenaeus of Lyon, refer to Christ and Panagia as the Second Adam and the Second Eve. Why is the Most Holy Theotokos called the "Second Eve?" And why is Christ called the "Second Adam?" How do Christ and Panagia fulfill and go beyond their prototypes?

TOPIC 3: Christ says, "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke22:1). He also says, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you" (John 6:53). Explore the Orthodox teaching on the Eucharist by reading the prayers of the Divine Liturgy, the writings of one or more Church Fathers.

TOPIC 4: The number of natural disasters worldwide continues to increase, resulting in more communities destroyed and more lives lost. How would you respond to someone who questions why God allows natural disasters to happen when we know God can intervene at any moment? If God is all-knowing, all-powerful, and all-loving, how can He allow evil things to happen?

TOPIC 5: During the Divine Liturgy, before the Consecration of the Holy Gifts, we hear the priest say the following: "Your own of Your own we offer to You, in all and for all." What does this petition mean to you as an Orthodox Christian? Why is it important for us to focus on giving back out of the gifts we have been given by God?



<u>How to donate to the Nativity of Christ from your IRA if you are over 72</u>

Using a **Qualified Charitable Distribution** (QCD) is a great way for folks over 72 with an IRA who need to withdraw funds to meet a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) to contribute to Nativity's Beyond 50 campaign or Stewardship fund. The money you contribute to Nativity using a QCD is not included in your adjusted gross income on your tax return, which is a better option than listing the donation as a simple charitable contribution. According to the IRS:

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is generally a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of your IRA (other than a SEP or SIMPLE IRA) to an organization eligible to receive tax deductible contributions. You must be at least age 72, when the distribution was made. Also, you must have the same type of acknowledgment of your contribution that you would need to claim a deduction for charitable contribution.

A Lasting Gift for the Church – (Planned Giving)

A bequest or gift through your will is one of the simplest ways to make a lasting gift to the Church. Please consult your financial advisor for advice. A suggested wording: I hereby bequeath the sum of \$_____ as a charitable bequest to the Nativity of Christ Greek Orthodox Church of Novato (Tax ID23-7122395) to be used for charitable purposes of the Church.
