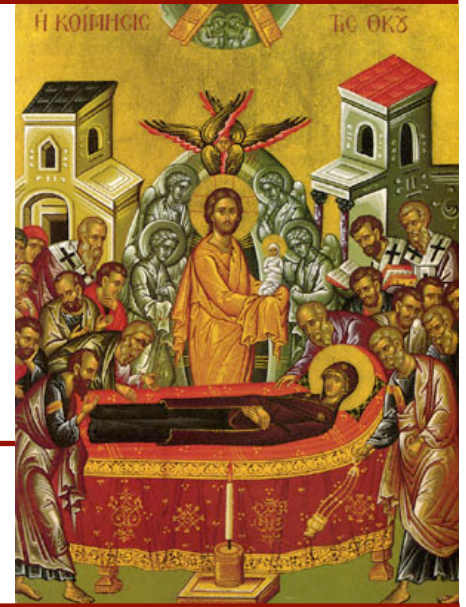

My family and I just returned from Greece and the Archdiocesan ministry of Ionian Village. It was truly an unforgettable and spiritually uplifting experience. I hope you all have been able to read my updates these last several weeks (sent through email and social media) that gave a glimpse into the rich experience awaiting us as Orthodox Christians.



Through Ionian Village, 190 high school campers opened their minds and hearts to deepen their understanding of their Orthodox faith. Coupled with archeological and historically significant cultural sites, these teenagers truly deepened their understanding of their divine purpose, while forging life-long friendships with like-minded peers from all over the United States.

This summer experience reemphasized what I learned sixteen years ago when I last



served as a counselor: Ionian Village enriches the lives of our youth by immersing them in a Christian environment and deepens their understanding and connection to God by blending our faith with our Hellenic heritage.

The prominent Athenian statesman, Pericles, offers a perfect example of Ancient Greece's foundation to Christianity. Christ did not come into this world to be engraved in stone monuments. Rather, to be woven into the lives of all those who believe in Him.

I thank all of you for your continued prayers and I particularly thank Fr. Constantine Efstathiou for providing liturgical services and attending to the pastoral needs of the parish in my absence. I look forward to continuing to share my experiences and pray we may continue the sentiments of Pericles by weaving our love for Christ into the lives of others.

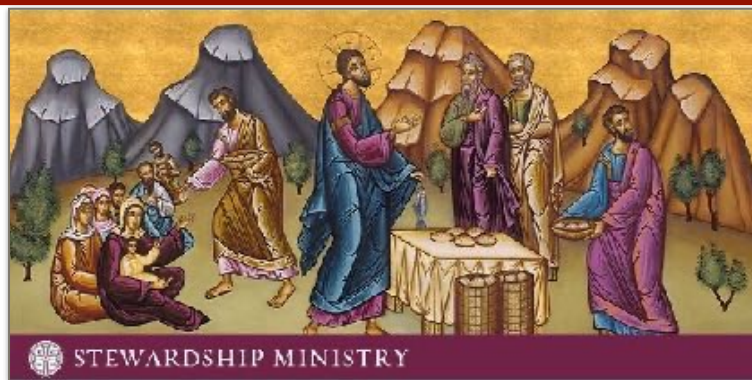

In the summer months, there is an abundance of fruits and vegetables we enjoy. They all started with a seed. The more seeds one sows, the larger harvest they will reap. Seeds are so small, yet planted in the right soil and cared for, they will yield their intended produce.

I recall my parents in the summer months watering their garden almost daily, watching the fruit ripen to perfection, ready to be picked, and proudly bringing in from their garden ripe tomatoes, plums, and cherries.

Our offering to God is often referred to as a seed, and there is no better place to sow your seeds than in God's house. In 2 Corinthians 9:8, "And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." So during this time, while perhaps some of you may be reaping the benefits of your garden from seeds planted, let us not forget about sowing our seeds in God's house. When we give, we are investing in God's Kingdom, trusting Him to bring forth a harvest of righteousness, provision, and blessing.



The Transfiguration

Our Lord had spoken to His disciples many times not only concerning His Passion, Cross, and Death, but also concerning the coming persecutions and afflictions that they themselves would endure. Since all these evils were near at hand, but the enjoyment of good things which they hoped to receive in their stead was yet to come, our Savior desired to give them full assurance, evidently and openly, concerning that glory which is prepared for those who endure to the end. Therefore, fulfilling that which He had promised shortly before, that "there be some standing here which shall not taste of death, till they see the Son of man coming in His Kingdom (Matt. 16:28)."

He took His three foremost disciples and ascended Mount Tabor, where He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became white as the light. Suddenly, together with this dread and marvelous effulgence of light, there appeared those pinnacles of the Prophets, Moses and Elias, who spoke with the Lord Jesus



concerning His saving Passion which was about to take place. Standing before Him as reverent servants, they showed that He is the Lord of both the living and the dead, for Moses came forth from Hades, having died many centuries before, and Elias, as it were from heaven, whither he had been taken up while yet alive. After a little while a radiant cloud overshadowed them and out of the cloud they heard that same voice which had been heard at the Jordan at the Baptism of Christ, testifying to the Divinity of Jesus and saying: "This is My beloved Son, in Whom I am well-pleased; hear ye Him (Matt. 17: 5)."

Such are the marvels, truly worthy of God, celebrated in this present feast, which is an image and prefiguring of the future state of the righteous, whose splendor the Lord spoke of, saying: "Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun (Matt. 13:43)." According to tradition, the Lord's Transfiguration came to pass 40 days before His Crucifixion; this is why the Transfiguration is celebrated 40 days before the Exaltation of the Cross.

Selection of General Contractor: McDevitt Construction Partners

At their July meeting, the Parish Council unanimously approved a General Contractor for our Beyond 50 capital projects based on the recommendation of the recently formed NOC Building Committee. Through the efforts of the Building Committee (Ed Keller, Bryan Hall, John Hunter, Eileen Gordon, Patrick Fuss, Nonda Kozas, and Nick Eftimiou) and CJK Design, a wide-ranging slate of contractors was pursued (18 in total), ultimately leading us to a final list of three highly qualified providers - DesCor Builders, McDevitt Construction, and Thompson Builders Corporation. All three organizations provided company presentations along with conceptual budget estimates and each participated in a Zoom interview.

As part of the selection process, the Committee evaluated each contractor on the following criteria:

- Credentials and Track Record
- Financial Stability
- Principal Participation
- Solid Non-Profit Base of Work/Familiarity and Experience
- Best Concept Budget and Understanding
- Energy and Spirit for Church and Project

Some additional areas of consideration were:

- Amount of upfront work for project understanding and insights (Most questions)
- Subcontractor Process (Outsourced versus Self-Perform)
- Location
- Right Size and structure to respond to NOC challenges

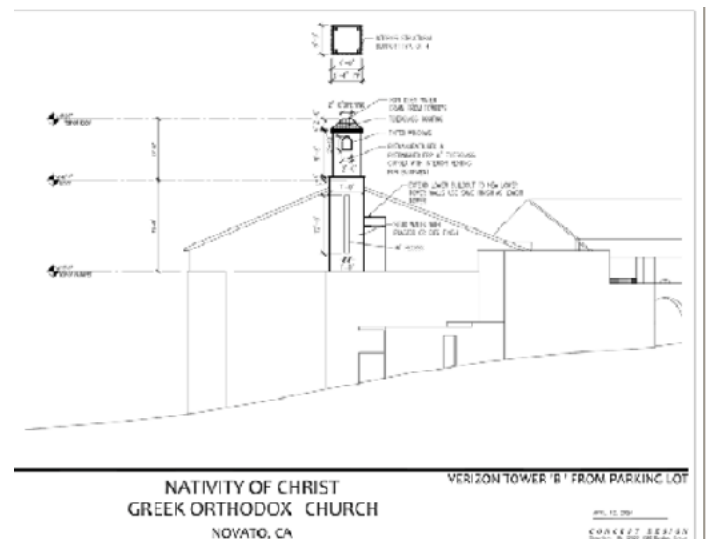
While all three Contractors scored high across many of the criteria, the Building Committee unanimously recommended McDevitt Construction. McDevitt not only meets all of the criteria, but they have demonstrated the most interest, have done the most due diligence, and have engaged with us through the highest levels of their organization.



The Parish Council, Building Committee, and CJK firmly believe that McDevitt will best meet NOC's needs and will add much to our efforts on all fronts. Nativity of Christ will now enter into a Letter of Intent with McDevitt and ultimately a formal contract. McDevitt will now provide a level of partnership and support critical for our success. Truly this marks an exciting next step in the process of completing our capital projects!

Verizon Construction

Immediately after the conclusion of the Festival, Verizon began preliminary construction for the installation of their new cell phone antennas. In the coming months, the most noticeable change will be the heightened cupola on our Large Hall. Please refer to the November 2024 Word on our website for a more detailed explanation of Verizon's presence at Nativity. This has been a long anticipated process and we continue to give thanks to Steve Rouman, Kimon Daifotis, and our IT consultant, Ian Johnson, for ensuring an advantageous position for our Parish.

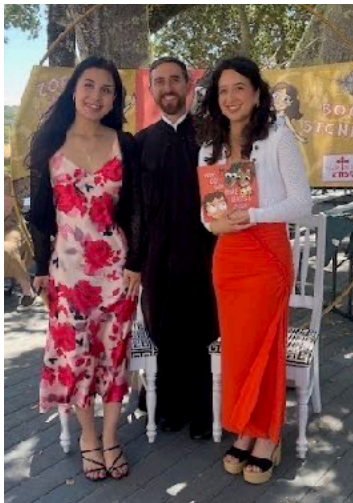

Ionian Village Highlights

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In 1966, the Government of Greece offered the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America a 2,850 acre tract of land to be used exclusively as a camp facility for Greek-American young people. Since 1970, more than 20,000 campers have become part of a 55-year-old tradition dedicated to building “faith and friendships that last a lifetime” through Ionian Village.
