

"And the Word became flesh & dwelt among us, full of grace & truth." ~John 1:14



"Why is church important? Why do we have to go?" These questions might arise in our busy lives but when we hear the violence, death, and war that exist in our world today, the question quickly transfigures to, "how can I live without the church? How can I possibly find hope in this world without Christ?"

Recently at the Metropolis parenting seminar, it was emphasized that faith and virtues are not "taught" but rather are "caught" to our children. This is all the more motivation that we each have to always struggle to find our "why" for our relationship with Christ and involvement in the Church.

During the Fall Parish Assembly, Fr. John addressed a concern that the Narthex expansion would erase 50 years of memories and dismiss the sacrifice of previous generations. Father reminded the Assembly that the goal of these projects, particularly the Narthex expansion, is certainly not to erase, but further build upon the contribution of previous generations. The support of several founding families is a small, yet significant example of this support.

On September 6, the Design Review Commission unanimously approved our architectural

renderings and in the coming months we are anticipating the approval of the Planning Commission and Novato City Council. Before final plans are submitted, the feedback of parishioners is desired so all are invited for a Workshop on Sunday, November 5 as more details of the design and timeline will be discussed.

Father then reflected about church attendance and how the pandemic revealed that very few families come to church simply just to pray. There is an additional desire for a sense of community, to be part of a family of Orthodox believers. For this reason the Beyond 50 Plan was never just about buildings, but also ministries that are harmoniously intertwined with our facilities. Eleni Kelley has tremendous energy and has recently been hired as Ministries Director on a part-time basis.

In closing, Fr. John encouraged everyone to reflect upon how we each will sacrifice and contribute to build upon the faith of our previous generations. We each must find our "why" and live our faith so Orthodoxy is not "taught," but "caught" by our children for generations to come.



Catherine the Great Martyr of Alexandria

Saint Catherine, who was from Alexandria, was the daughter of Constas (or Cestus). She was an exceedingly beautiful maiden, most chaste, and illustrious in wealth, lineage, and learning. By her

steadfast understanding, she utterly vanquished the passionate and unbridled soul of Maximinus, the tyrant of Alexandria; and by her eloquence, she stopped the mouths of the so-called philosophers who had been gathered to dispute with her. She was crowned with the crown of martyrdom in the year 305. Her holy relics were taken by Angels to the holy mountain of Sinai, where they were discovered many years later; the famous monastery of Saint Catherine was originally dedicated to the Holy Transfiguration of the Lord and the Burning Bush, but later was dedicated to Saint Catherine. According to the ancient usage, Saints Catherine and Mercurius were celebrated on the 24th of this month, whereas the holy Hieromartyrs Clement of Rome and Peter of Alexandria were celebrated on the 25th. The dates of the feasts of these Saints were interchanged at the request of the Church and Monastery of Mount Sinai, so that the festival of Saint Catherine, their patron, might be celebrated more festively together with the Apodosis of the Feast of the Entry of the Theotokos. The Slavic Churches, however, commemorate these Saints on their original dates.

<u>Did you know...Philoptochos History:</u>

Philoptochos rallied its chapters – sending food, clothing, medicine, and financial support to the stricken inhabitants of the islands affected by the 1953 Ionian earthquake (also known as the Great Kefalonia earthquake) struck the southern Ionian Islands. In mid-August, there were over 113 recorded earthquakes in the region between Kefalonia and Zakynthos, and the most destructive was the August 12 earthquake which measured 6.8 magnitude. It raised the whole island of Kefalonia by Work like this continues 60 cm (24 in)! today with the Floods and Fire Funds for Greece and Maui.






