On behalf of my family, I thank all of you for your support in the passing of my mother, Chryssi Kocolas. Between cards, flowers, meals, donations to Beyond 50, and even attending her services in Modesto, my family has been blessed by your support.

Her marriage, her motherhood, her life, were all through the lens of her unwavering faith. As the world so easily relies on modern technological science, advancements, sports entertainment as means of joy, hope...Chryssi purpose, and Kocolas lit candles. She would light as many as her hands and arms could carry out of her love for all those whom she prayed.

It is easy to get caught up in the cares of this life and lose perspective on what is truly important. We often need something or someone to help us take a step back, to help us refocus on our true priories. Chryssi never took a step forward. In her own unique way, she was always there to remind us of how we should really be spending our time, our talents, and even our treasure.

Chryssi certainly had a sweet, kind, and compassionate demeanor, until she spoke with authority. She would regularly express her frustration with the world when she would witness a lack of focus on family and little to no emphasis on God. To the point that she would commonly say, "O Κόσμος θέλει φώτιση. The world needs enlightenment."

As God's will would have it, after the Divine Liturgy on the feast of Theophany, I received a call from my mother who enlightened me, that her stomach pains were actually caused by a tumor, growing in her pancreas. Even though the scan wasn't read by an oncologist, the doctor was confident that it was stage 4.

As we eventually received her official diagnosis and prognosis, my family was prepared to rely modern medicine, technological advancements, and scientific research. Chryssi Kocolas lit candles. Our prayer, was for a miracle, and for God to lift this cup from us to avoid pain and suffering. Chryssi's prayer was full of gratitude for all her blessings and for our Lord to receive her soul in His heavenly

kingdom.

The final weeks of her life undoubtedly authenticated her Christian living and expressions of faith prior to her diagnosis. Her faith did not weaken, rather, it amplified and projected for all of us to witness what faith truly means. Our life in this world is temporary but through our love for Jesus Christ and one another, we are promised a life with no pain, sorrow, or suffering, but life everlasting.

For all who have said, "let us know if there's anything we can do," here's your list: 1. Pray for (and with) your children, and take them to church. 2. Reach out to someone you're thinking about. Them entering your mind is not a coincidence. 3. Trust in God. It's easy to rely on modern medicine, science, or technology, but nothing should ever replace our complete trust and faith in God.


May we always be enlightened and illuminated to know that God sent each of us His Son, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life, and that LIFE IS HOPE.





Great Lent marks the 40 days leading to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, the 40 days before Holy Week, which is the week when Christian Orthodox followers remember Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection. Let us remember some important ways we can reflect as we continue on our Lenten journey:

- 1. PRAYER set aside dedicated time each day for prayer, meditation and quiet reflection.
- 2. FASTING Consider fasting from certain foods, habits, or distractions that may draw you away from your spiritual focus.
- 3. REPENTANCE Take time to examine your heart and acknowledge areas where you may have fallen short, and seek forgiveness.
- 4. CHARITY Practice generosity and compassion by reaching out to those in need.
- 5. CHURCH Participate in church services to reflect the significance of Christ's sacrifice and resurrection.

This is a time for us Christians to deepen our relationship with God, seek spiritual renewal, and prepare our hearts for the joyous celebration of Pascha. <u>Stewardship forms are available online.</u>
