

"And the Word became flesh & dwelt among us, full of grace & truth." ~John 1:14



Beloved in Christ,

Tonight we enter into the holiest and most sacred days of our Church year. We begin with what is known as the **Bridegroom Service**, the Matins of Holy Monday, celebrated on Palm Sunday evening. And at the center of this service, we are given one of the most tender, mysterious, and powerful images of our Lord Jesus Christ: **Christ as the Bridegroom**.

Not a bridegroom of earthly romance. Not a figure of sentimental love. But the Bridegroom of the Church, the Bridegroom of the soul. The One who, with unsearchable humility and infinite love, offers His very life for His Bride—you, me, the Church.

This haunting line, sung again and again during these services, calls us into watchfulness:

"Behold, the Bridegroom comes in the middle of the night, and blessed is the servant whom He shall find watching."

Christ comes at the middle of the night—when all is still, when many are asleep, when the world slumbers in darkness and sin. And He comes not in wrath, but in love. He comes,

like in the Parable of the Ten Virgins (Matthew 25), seeking those whose hearts are burning with longing, whose lamps are filled with oil—the oil of faith, love, and repentance.

Tonight's Bridegroom is the One who rode into Jerusalem with palm branches waving—but who now walks the road of suffering. He is both **King** and **Lover**. And He is seeking His Bride.

The Church Fathers often speak of the relationship between Christ and the Church as a marriage. St. Paul tells us in Ephesians 5:

"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the Church and gave Himself for her."

This is not poetic metaphor. This is the mystery of salvation.

Christ is not content to remain at a distance. He joins Himself to His people with a bond deeper than anything on earth. He takes on flesh, becomes man, and allows Himself to be betrayed, crucified, buried—all to redeem, purify, and wed His Bride.

But unlike earthly marriages, where the bride prepares for her husband, it is here the **Bridegroom who prepares the Bride**. He washes her with His Blood. He adorns her with mercy. And even when she—when we—wander and betray Him, He



pursues us.

This is not a cold or abstract love. This is the burning, divine love of God who longs for communion with His creation.

St. Paisios of the Holy Mountain, a man truly aflame with love for Christ, once said:

"Christ is not a judge who punishes us. Christ is a Bridegroom who loves us. And when you love someone, you are always watching for them. That's what watchfulness means—to be waiting with love."

Too often, we approach Holy Week as a series of long services, or as a time to "be better Christians." But St. Paisios reminds us: it is not about performance, it is about relationship.

The Bridegroom is not checking our records; He is seeking our hearts. He longs for us to stay awake, to meet Him in prayer, in tears, in silence, in love.

Paisios also said that many souls are asleep, not because they are evil, but because they do not know how deeply they are loved. Tonight, we are reminded that the Bridegroom knocks gently on the door—not to scold us, but to wake us to love.

St. Porphyrios once said:

"When you fall in love with Christ, everything changes. You become light. You live in another world. You live with joy."

This is what the Bridegroom service invites us to experience—not guilt, not fear, but **love**. A transfiguring, illuminating love that changes how we see everything.

Porphyrios often said that holiness does not come through pressure, but through falling in love with Christ. That is why we fast, why we pray, why we go through these long and beautiful services—not to earn anything, but to make space for love to grow.

When we behold the icon of Christ the Bridegroom—crowned with thorns, clothed in a purple robe, mocked by soldiers—we are not meant to see defeat. We are meant to see the God who loves us to the end. This is the Lover of mankind, who conquers through surrender, who reigns from the Cross, and who enters even death to win us back.

The entire journey of Holy Week is a **wedding procession**. On Holy Thursday, the Bridegroom will offer the bridal feast—His own Body and Blood. On Great and Holy Friday, He will go to the Cross, the wedding bed where He will pour out His life for the salvation of the world. And on Pascha, He will rise from the dead, the Bridegroom leaping from the tomb to greet His Bride with the cry: "Rejoice!"

So tonight, we must ask ourselves: Are we watching? Are we ready? Do we long for Him?

Or have our lamps gone out? Have we filled our lives with distractions, anxieties, and idols that steal our love from the One who alone can fulfill it?

Now is the time to awaken. The Bridegroom comes not with condemnation, but with mercy. Even now, we can rise, trim our lamps, and prepare our hearts.

Let us respond to Christ the Bridegroom in practical ways this week:

- Attend the Bridegroom services with attentiveness and open hearts
- **Read the Gospels** of Christ's Passion slowly and prayerfully.
- Fast not only from food, but from 2025 May Word

distractions—social media, idle talk, judgment, self-pity.

- Run to Confession, where the Bridegroom clothes us in the garment of forgiveness.
- And above all, fall in love again with Christ—in prayer, in tears, in quiet joy.

Brothers and sisters, we were made for this love. The soul's deepest longing is to be united with Christ. And Christ's longing is to be united with us.

Let us not leave Him waiting.

Tonight, the doors of the wedding chamber are opening. Let us enter with reverence, with repentance, and with love. Let our hearts cry out, like the hymn says:

"I see Thy bridal chamber adorned, O my Savior, but I have no garment that I may enter. O Giver of Light, make radiant the garment of my soul, and save me."

May Christ our Bridegroom find us watching. May our lamps be burning. And may our hearts be awakened by the fire of His divine love.

Amen.


Beyond 50 Update






