



April 2025: Beyond 50 Update Connect • Engage • Grow

On Sunday, March 9, and Thursday, March 20, two Beyond 50 Capital Project Workshops were offered for parishioners to provide a better understanding, and gather feedback, about the four recently approved capital projects: Elevator, Small Hall, Narthex Gateway, and enlarged Dome. These workshop sessions provided fruitful discussions

helped familiarize parishioners on how these projects will enhance our current facilities.

Providing improved accessibility, with the installation of an elevator on our campus, continues to be a very important topic for many parishioners. The type of elevator best suited for our

grounds is still yet to be decided. Three different models are being considered: (1) a Lift, (2) a LULA, and (3) an Elevator. Each model has its own specifications and price point.

LIFT

A Lift is the lowest price point as it is the slowest, least user-friendly, and smallest of the three options. Although a Lift is technically a possibility, it is not currently being considered as the best option for Nativity.

For those interested testing out this option, a Lift is located at the offices of CIK Studios at 2 Commercial Blvd. in Novato.

LULA

When compared to the Lift and the Elevator, a LULA use/limited (limited

application) is the midpoint in speed, cabin space, and price. Unlike a Lift, it operates identically as a standard elevator. It provides a wheelchair accessibility option for spaces that are too small for standard elevators but require more capacity than a Lift. Additionally, a LULA requires minimal maintenance as there are fewer mechanical parts than a standard elevator.

For those who wish to test out this option, a two-

stop LULA is located at 95 Racquet Club Drive in San Rafael, and a three-stop LULA is located at 10 S Knoll Road in Mill Valley.

ELEVATOR

A standard elevator has the highest capacity and is the fastest, but is the most expensive of the three options. An elevator will certainly be the smoothest

> and spacious most experience, however, because of its large footprint and complex system, it will be the most extensive installation. Compared to the other options, the elevator requires more frequent maintenance and has higher operational expenses.

standard elevator Nativity would resemble all other standard commercial elevators.

TWO-STOP vs THREE-STOP

Another choice being considered is whether to install a two-stop or three-stop Elevator or LULA. A two-stop would connect the upper courtyard (church/classrooms/offices) with the lower level (Large Hall and back patios).

A three-stop Elevator or LULA would connect the approximately 4,000 square feet of unfinished space below the Large Hall. The cost of an added stop, and additional excavation. would be considered an investment for the future development of the currently unused space.



WHAT ARE THE NEXT STEPS?

The primary goal of the Elevator or LULA is to accommodate those who are in need of accessibility on our grounds. Parishioners are encouraged to communicate their preference to Fr. John or Steve Rouman for a Lift, LULA, or Elevator. This will help provide the necessary direction in determining the cost benefits of installing a two-stop or three-stop elevator.

Why do we receive Palm Crosses on Palm Sunday instead of just plain palm branches?

When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, the people gathered along the road on both sides cheered and greeted him with palm branches;

Later in that week, the crowds would shout "Let Him (Jesus) be crucified (on the cross)." So the palm crosses we make on Lazarus Saturday and receive from the priest on Palm Sunday remind us of Christ's entry into Jerusalem, his crucifixion on Holy Friday, and ultimately his victory over death through His Resurrection.




OCMC Lenten Project



How to donate to the Nativity of Christ from your IRA if you are over 72

Using a **Qualified Charitable Distribution** (QCD) is a great way for folks over 72 with an IRA who need to withdraw funds to meet a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) to contribute to Nativity's Beyond 50 campaign or Stewardship fund. The money you contribute to Nativity using a QCD is not included in your adjusted gross income on your tax return, which is a better option than listing the donation as a simple charitable contribution. According to the IRS:

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is generally a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of your IRA (other than a SEP or SIMPLE IRA) to an organization eligible to receive tax deductible contributions. You must be at least age 72, when the distribution was made. Also, you must have the same type of acknowledgment of your contribution that you would need to claim a deduction for a charitable contribution.

A Lasting Gift for the Church – (Planned Giving)

A bequest or gift through your will is one of the simplest ways to make a lasting gift to the Church. Please consult your financial advisor for advice. A suggested wording: I hereby bequeath the sum of \$_____ as a charitable bequest to the Nativity of Christ Greek Orthodox Church of Novato (Tax ID23-7122395) to be used for charitable purposes of the Church.
