

<u>Pentecost: A New Community</u> <u>and a New Way of Life</u>

Following the celebration of Pascha, we enter a most joyous period of the liturgical year, the period of the Pentecostarion, extending from Easter Sunday to Pentecost which is celebrated fifty days after Pascha. Pentecost marks the birth of the Church, the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and first followers of Christ as described in the second chapter of the Book of Acts in the New Testament.

When Christ began His ministry, He was "full of the Holy Spirit." He came to heal and to preach "in the power of the Holy Spirit." His goal was to renew people, to make them whole, and to give them the Holy Spirit.

Jesus had charged His disciples not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father: "John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit." It was by this power from heaven that they were to be witnesses of Christ from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth. On the day of Pentecost they were "filled with the Holy Spirit" and began to proclaim Jesus of Nazareth as Christ the Lord. The power that drove them to proclaim the message of the Risen Lord was the presence of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

As Christians we have received the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Chrismation; and we receive His power anew, again and again, and it grows in us by our faithful response to Christ and the keeping of His commandments. The Holy Spirit is the power by which we know, experience, and rejoice in God personally. That is our calling and our goal as Christians. What an awesome prospect! "To believe in God is one thing, to know God another," said St. Silouan. "Humble yourself, practice Christ's commandments, and fervently pray to God to give you of the wisdom, love, and joy of the Holy Spirit."

The purpose of the Church as God's New Community of faith is to redeem, sanctify, and deify

its members, to make them truly members of the Body of Christ. "As many of you as have been baptized into Christ, have put on Christ," we chant at every Baptism, quoting from St. Paul's letter to the Galatians. It is the sacrament of Baptism that initiates us into God's New Community, the Church, the mystical Body of Christ. We renounce Satan, and acknowledge Christ, the Founder and Savior of the New Community, and Redeemer of the world. We accept, and commit our life to Christ. We are incorporated into His Body and are nurtured and grow by participation in His divine grace.

As a New Community, the Church works within the world, renewing and sanctifying and teaching its members new ways to relate to the other members and to others around them. Jesus several times used the image of hunger and thirst, and their satisfaction, to convey God's precious gift to man: The forgiveness of sins and the grace of the Holy Spirit, which transfigures and nourishes our

souls. Are you thirsty? Are you hungry? Learn to nourish yourself with Christ; learn to feed on the bread of His love. Believe in Him. Receive His words as the words of life. Honor and worship Him in spirit and truth. Seek His forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Receive Him in Holy Communion regularly. Abide in

Him through prayer; learn of Him through the reading of Holy Scripture. Whoever you are, wherever you are, and whatever you do, relate your life to Christ, carry out your tasks in His Name and for His honor, and the very work you do will be transformed into spiritual food for you because of Him.

<u>Beuond 50</u>

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On Wednesday, June 7, we participated in a Design Review Workshop at Novato City Hall. Members of the Novato Design Review Commission (DRC) were present (Mark Schatz, Michael Barber, and Joseph Farrell) in addition to members of the Novato Planning Division (Steve Marshall and Vivek Damodaran).



BEYOND 50

Fr. John spoke first, communicating to the DRC that Nativity has received tremendous support from the neighborhood. Christ Kamages then gave a presentation highlighting the goals and aspirations of our projects. Members of the DRC and attendees from Nativity (Ed Keller, Steve Rouman, Dina Stathis, and Spiro Stratigos) then gathered for a roundtable discussion on the projects.

There were five areas of suggestions & refinement by the DRC:

- Roof line. It was suggested to make the roofline of the Narthex addition one level the entire way.
- Updated Landscape Plan. It was desired to have a clear understanding of the type and composition of the trees that will be landscaped.
- Bathroom connection. It was suggested that both bathrooms in the Narthex addition should be accessed through the hallway.
- Retaining Wall. The retaining wall should be stucco like the existing building and not be a living wall.
- Lighting. The DRC wanted to ensure that there would be no obtrusive lighting. CJK offered to provide appropriate graphics for the next DRC meeting.

Apart from these suggestions, all members of the DRC were extremely impressed with the project and overwhelmingly supported how this project:


- Gives a welcoming front entrance.
- •Creates a convenient drop off, particularly for seniors.
- •Creates a physical presence through the increased size of the dome.
- Offers creative architectural features with the asymmetry of the front two bell towers

Additional comments from the DRC: "I'd vote yes on this today if I could." "It's a tremendous improvement and great use of the space." "It's an honor to be part of this project."

We are anticipating the public hearing for the official Design Review approval to be held on Wednesday, July 19 at Novato City Hall. After this approval, the plans will then need to be approved by the Novato Planning Commission and the Novato City Council.

We look forward to engaging with parishioners in the coming months through various workshops to involve the Parish community on this exciting progress. A special Parish Assembly will be held prior to submitting plans to the City of Novato for building permits.

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What is Stewardship?


A primary goal of Stewardship is to promote spiritual growth and strengthen our faith in God.

The Dormition of the Theotokos

The Feast of the Dormition of Our Most Holy Lady, the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary is celebrated on August 15 each year. The Feast commemorates the repose (dormition and, in the Greek kimisis) or "falling-asleep" of the Mother of Jesus Christ, our Lord. The Feast also commemorates the translation or assumption into heaven of the body of the Theotokos.

The Holy Scriptures tell us that when our Lord was dying on the Cross, He saw His mother and His disciple John and said to the Virgin Mary, "Woman, behold your son!" and to John, "Behold your mother!" (John 19:25-27). From that hour, the Apostle took care of the Theotokos in his own home.

Along with the biblical reference in Acts 1:14 that confirms that the Virgin Mary was with the Holy Apostles on the day of Pentecost, the tradition of the Church holds that she remained in the home of the Apostle John in Jerusalem, continuing a ministry in word and deed.

At the time of her death, the disciples of our Lord who were preaching throughout the world returned to Jerusalem to see the Theotokos. Except for the Apostle Thomas, all of them including the Apostle Paul were gathered together at her bedside. At the moment of her death, Jesus Christ himself descended and carried her soul into heaven.

Following her repose, the body of the Theotokos was taken in procession and laid in a tomb near the Garden of Gethsemane. When the Apostle Thomas arrived three days after her repose and desired to see her body, the tomb was found to be empty. The bodily assumption of the Theotokos was confirmed by the message of an angel and by her appearance to the Apostles.
